Directions to the Fortress

Burg Wilenstein is located about 13 kilometres south of Kaiserslautern and not far from the famous Karlstal Valley and Trippstadt, known for its health resort.

By car

Follow the Highway A6 to the Exit "Kaiserslaut**ern-West"** and continue on the **B270** in the direction of **Pirmasens**. After about 10 km, you will see the sign directing you to the left towards Karlstal. Follow this route until you get to Gasthaus "Klugsche Mühle". Just before getting to the Gasthaus, you will see a sign leading you up to Burg Wilenstein. If you are coming from Trippstadt/Johanniskreuz, drive right behind "Klugsche Mühle" to the Fortress.

There are **14 parking spaces** for cars at the fortress. It is not possible to drive up to the fortress by bus, so please use the parking space at Wilensteiner Hof for offloading the passengers and luggage.

By Public Transport

You can catch the **bus line 150** from the bus station at **Kaiserslautern Main Train station**. Get off at the station **"Burgermeisteramt"** in Trippstadt. From there, it is a 20 minute walk.





Location and History



Burg Wilenstein is located west of the idyllic city Trippstadt in the heart of the Biosphere reservation park "Naturpark Pfälzer Wald". This is one of the largest forested areas in Germany.

The fortress Wilenstein is situated above the wildly romantic Karlstal Valley. It originates from the late 12th century and is made up of the two Knight houses Flörsheim and Falkenstein. Fortress Wilenstein was probably built in the year 1152 during the times of Emperor Friedrich Barbarossa. Since the Thirty Years' War only ruins remain.

In the 1960's, some students, young teachers and their Professor Dr Walter Cappel from the College of Education Kaiserslautern started a project to rebuild the Knight House Falkenstein into a youth hostel mainly as a meeting place and for school excursions.

The "Burg Wilenstein Association" was a result of this project and is running the non-profit youth hostel. This group is also maintaining the fortress.

The house sleeps about **40 people,** with **2 - 8 bed rooms** (3 Bedrooms with 4 beds, 3 Bedrooms with 6 beds, 1 Bedroom with 2 beds and 1 bedroom with 8 Beds). The rooms have bunk beds and a sink. Showers and toilets are located on each floor

The **fortress courtyard** with a stage and a table tennis platform provides lots of space for playing, fun and festivities.
